# **Constitution Day**

On September 14, Brandt Goldstein, author of "The Storming of the Court: How a Band of Lawyers Sued the President and Won," will speak on the constitutional issues of the case in which 300 Haitian refugees who were eligible for political asylum in the U.S. were detained at Guantanamo Bay. The book chronicles the efforts of a group of Yale Law School students to secure the release of the refugees.
