Anderson, leader of the Knights of Columbus; Sister Ann Bailie, O.P., Dominican Sister of Peace; Jane Nady Sigmon '70, senior coordinator for international programs in the U.S. State Department's Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking in Persons; and Lula White, retired educator, who in 1961 chose to join the Civil Rights Movement as a Freedom Rider. <u>Commencement</u>

#### UNIVERSITY OF HARTFORD HONORS AMC ALUMNA

Senior U.S. District Court Judge Ellen Bree Burns '44S, Trustee Emerita of the College, received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from the University of Hartford, Sunday, May 16. The citation read in part: "...your long and barrier-shattering career as an office of the court is an inspiration to us all. After graduation from Albertus Magnus College and Yale Law School, you provided distinguished service to the Connecticut General Assembly for 26 years. You then served as a judge of the Connecticut Circuit and Common Pleas Courts and in 1976 became the first woman in Connecticut's history to be named a Superior Court judge. You were again a first for Connecticut when, in 1978, President Jimmy Carter named you a U.S. District Court judge--at that time only the 10th woman in American history to be appointed to a federal judgeship...A trailblazer for the judiciary, Judge Burns, you are admired as a model of fairness, applauded for your dedication and skill, and praised for your devotion to the rule of law...."
