One of major national and international concerns today is the issue of human trafficking. On Tuesday, November 17, Jane Nady Sigmon '70, the U.S. Department of State's senior coordinator for international programs in the Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking in Persons, will speak on "Global Issues: Human Trafficking." HELPING OUT

The College's Campus Ministry Team has launched its first community service project for the academic year: to provide the local Strong School (a New Haven public school where three of our students are doing teacher observing) and St. Martin de Porres Academy (which provides faith-based, tuition-free educations for girls and boys from low-income families in the greater New Haven area) with school supplies and books for their students. StrongSchool serves 300 pre-K through first grade students, and the need is great for coloring books, pencils, crayons, drawing paper and new or gently used colorful reading books in English and Spanish. St. Martin de Porres Academy is seeking dictionaries, school supplies, books on sports figures and famous men and women for its seventh graders. The drive runs through November 16; drop off points are on the main campus and at New Dimensions.
